

ADYEXT – DAE Symptom Extraction Routine

Function: ADYEXT provides the visible keywords and the symptom data for one or more MVS and RETAIN symptoms.

Entry-Point ADYEXT:

Callers: ADYHDFMT, ADYPRED.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Exit-Error: No exit error conditions.

External-References: ADYEXTT.

ADYEXTT – DAE Keyword Data Access Routine

Function: ADYEXTT accesses dump analysis and elimination keyword data and returns it to the caller in the symptom extraction parameter list (DSX).

Entry-Point ADYEXTT:

Callers: ADYEXT.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Exit-Error: No exit error conditions.

External-References: None.

ADYHDFMT – DAE Dump Header Record Format Routine

Function: ADYHDFMT formats and prints the DAE data in the dump header record for either an SDUMP or a SYSMDUMP.

ADYIO – DAE Input/Output Processor Routine

ADYPARS - DAE Text Parsing Routine

Function: For each character string found in the input text (TXALL), ADYPARS creates an entry in the output table (TXAZZ). Each entry contains the following: a classification of the field type, the length of the field, and the pointer to the start of the field.

ADYPRED — DAE Pre-Dump Routine for SDUMP and SYSMDUMP

Function: ADYPRED constructs a symptom string in the dump header record. ADYPRED also determines whether the dump is a duplicate, and, if DAE is active and all suppression criteria are met, suppresses any duplicate dumps.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Exit-Error: No exit error conditions.

Entry-Point ADYPREDR: Provides recovery for pre-dump processing.

ADYPSTD – DAE Post-Dump Exit Routine

Function: ADYPSTD schedules a transaction on the DAE transaction processor queue whenever an SDUMP or a SYSMDUMP completes or is suppressed.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Exit-Error: No exit error conditions.

Entry-Point ADYPSTDR: Provides recovery for entry point ADYPSTD.

ADYSETP - DAE SET Command Processor

Function: ADYSETP reads, parses, and interprets DAE parameter records from members of SYS1.PARMLIB that are indicated by the SETDAE command. ADYSETP creates a transaction entry to represent the DAE commands.

IEAVETEF sets the length of the just-filtered TTE (TFWALJFE) so that the formatter controller knows where the next TTE begins. IEAVETEF calculates the number of words in an explicit TTE so that individual formatting routines can determine the number of output lines the TTE will require.

IEAVETFA — System Trace Formatter Service Routines

Function: IEAVETFA contains two service routines used within the system trace formatter:

IEAVETFA entry point informs the caller whether a specified ASID has been selected for formatting. TTEs that are not formatted are said to be filtered out. IEAVETFA determines whether branch and address space TTEs following the current TTE will be formatted when the caller requests this information.

IEAVETPB entry-point prints an output buffer. IEAVETPB prevents trace table entries from crossing an output page boundary when called by Print Dump, and prints the Print Dump TRACE verb syntax error messages to the SYSPRINT file.

Function: IEAVETPW primes the formatter work buffers from the system trace data in the current trace address space or a dump data set.

Function: This routine protects critical SVC Dump resources through the use of disabled interrupt exits (DIEs). IEAVTSDB protects the summary dump real storage buffer (RSB), system non-dispatchability, and the suspended unit or work during suspend summary dump processing.

Entry point IEAVTSDB

Entry from: IEAVAD00, IEAVTSDT, IEAVTSDX, IEAVTSSD

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Called routines: IARXPLCK, IARXPRSB, IEAVRSTD, SETDIE

IEAVTSDC - SVC Dump Clean Up Routine

Function: This module cleans up SVC dump resources at the end of a dump.

- Sets the system dispatchable, if necessary.
- Sets tasks in this address space dispatchable.
- Issues page frees on any modules that were page-fixed.
- Frees the System Trace table, if obtained by SDUMP.
- Writes end-of-file on the dump data set
- Issues IEA984E for end-of-file on tape.
- Issues IEA911E (dump completed message).
- Issues IEA994E or IEA994A, if all dump data sets are full.
- DOM IEA994E, if dump data sets are now available.
- Calls IEAVTSD1 to start post-dump exit processing.

Secondary entry-point IEAVTSDE is called for partial cleanup of each address space of a multiple address space dump.

Secondary entry-point IEAVTSDA is called as an attention exit when the operator mounts a new dump tape in response to message IEA984E.

Entry from: IEAVAD00 and IEAVPSDT for entry IEAVTSDC. IEAVAD00 (\$DESTAEX) and IEAVTSDT for entry IEAVTSDE. IEACVPST for entry IEAVTSDA.

Exit to: Caller.

Called routines: IEAVTSDP, IEAVTSDI.

IEAVTSDD - SVC Dump Data Set Initialization Routine

Function: This module parses the system parameters DUMP option and initializes the requested dump data sets and tapes. IEAVTSDD builds a queue of dump data set control blocks (SDDSQ) that is used by IEAVTSDH to select a dump data set.

Entry from: IEAVTSDI.

Exit to: Caller.

Called routines: NIP services - WTO, OPEN, MOUNT.

IEAVTSDF - SVC Dump GTF Trace Processor

Function: If TRT is a requested option in the SDUMP parameter list and GTF is active, this module invokes GTF to obtain the saved GTF trace records. It calls IEAVTSDP to write these records on the dump.

Entry from: IEAVAD00 and IEAVTSDT.

Exit to: Caller.

Called routines: IEAVTSDP.

IEAVTSDG - SVC Dump Global Storage Processor

Function: This module dumps the following system areas: SQA, CSA, global subpools requested by the caller, PSA, global storage ranges requested by the callers storage list, Nucleus, and the saved system trace table. IEAVTSDU is called to interface with global dump exits (ISGDSDMP for GRS). The system is set dispatchable after global storage has been dumped.

Entry from: IEAVAD00 and IEAVTSDT.

Exit to: Caller.

Called routines: IEAVTSD0, IEAVTSDU, IEAVTSDM, IEAVTVSM.

IEAVTSDH - SVC Dump Data Set Initialization

Function: This module chooses the dump data set for SVC dump. The SDUMP 4K buffer and the AMDPRDMP header record are written on the dump data set. If the console loop trace facility is available and active, it is dumped at this time. The range table to be used for dumping global storage is initialized with the addresses of system control blocks required in the dump.

Entry from: IEAVAD00, IEAVTSDT.

Exit to: Caller.

Called routines: IEAVTSDP, IEAVMSF1.

IEAVTSDI – SVC Dump Initialization RIM

Function: This module initializes system areas for SVC DUMP by doing the following:

- GETMAINs storage for SDUMP control blocks.
- Obtains the entry points of modules and saves the entry points for later use. Some modules are page-fixed.

Function: This module has three main functions.

- 2. Memory termination resource manager for address spaces involved in an SDUMP or for the DUMPSRV address space.
- 3. Task termination resource manager for failing dump tasks (IEAVTSDT).

The following cleanup is performed by this module for SDUMP.

IEAVTSKT via BALR for all task terminations.

Exit to: Caller.

Called routines: IARXPLCK, IARXPRSB, IEAVTSAS.

IEAVTSDS - SVC Dump Started Dump Task for DUMPSRV

Function: This modules is a never-ending task which controls the flow of SDUMP modules for dumping global storage.

Callers: IEAVTDSE and IEAVTDSV.

Exit-Normal: Returns to WAIT for the next dump request.

Exit-Error: SDSESTAE get control.

Entry-Point SDSESTAE recovers from unexpected errors suffered by mainline and cleans up it percolated to from IEAVTSD2's FRR.

It calls the SVC dump service modules to dump the requested storage of the address space in which this routine is awakened.

Entry from: Attached during address space creation, it goes into a WAIT at DUMPREQ. To process a dump, IEAVTSDT is POSTed and receives control at label DUMPREQ. When processing is completed, IEAVTSDT loops back to label DUMPREQ and goes into another WAIT.

Exit to: None. This is a never ending task (as long as the address space exists).

IEAVTSDU - SVC Dump Exit Interface Routine

Function: This module allows component dump exit routines to be invoked by SVC dump in order to add component-related data to the dump. A general parameter list is passed to the exit routine. The exits to be given control are specified in the dump exit list contained in the data csect IEAVTSXT. The following exits currently exist:

The Global Resource Sharing (GRS) SVC Dump exit (ISGDSDMP).

The Master Trace SVC Dump exit (IEEMB879).

Entry from:

IEAVTSDT via BALR at the end of the dump to IEEMB879.

IEAVTSDG via BALR after dumping global storage to process ISGDSDMP.

Exit to: Caller.

Called routines: IEEMB879, ISGDSDMP.

IEAVTSDW - SVC Dump Summary Dump Writer

Function: This module puts the data in the summary dump real storage frames into AMDPRDMP format and invokes module IEAVTSDP to write these constructed records on the dump data set. As the contents of each frame is written on the dump data set, the frame is returned to RSM using routine IARXPRSB.

Entry from: IEAVTSDT via BALR.

Exit to: Caller.

Called routines: IEAVTSDP, IARXPLCK, IARXPRSB.

IEAVTSDX — SVC Dump Branch Entry and Schedule Dump Routine

Function: This module schedules an SVC dump in the address space(s) specified by the caller supplied keywords, ASID, ASID list, TYPE = XMEM, TYPE = XMEME, LISTA, SUBPLST and LISTD. The address space(s), including home, in which the resident dump task is active.

Caller IAVTSGL.

Exit-Normal: Return to the caller (BSM).

Exit-Normal: Abend caller, program check.

Entry-Point IEAVTSDX cleans up after an error which occurred while attempting an SVC dump or while performing a summary dump. Retry is attempted in all cases. This FRR is always entered in home mode (PASID = SASID = HOME). Retry is never attempted for bind break abends or on retry errors. On retry cases, RTM is requested to set the cross memory mode to the time of the error. Bind break abends will cause RTM to re-enter the FRR which will then percolate. The SDWA VRA is filled with diagnostic data and the SDWA is recorded to LOGREC.

Callers: None

Exit-Normal: Return to RTM1 from schedule FRR.

External-References: IARXPRSB, IARXPLCK, IEAVTSSD, IEAVTSPR, ADYPRED, and IEAVTSDB.

IEAVTSD1 — SVC Dump Post-Dump Exit Startup Processor

Function: Invokes the post-dump exit process in the DUMPSRV address space.

- Initializes GETMAINed areas for post exit processing.
- ENQs the GETMAINed areas on the post exit processing queue.
- Cross memory post of IEAVTDSV to start post exit processing for this dump.
- DEQs from the post exit resource.

Exit from IEAVAD00 and IEAVTSDT for dump suppression path. IEAVTSDC for dump taken path.

Exit to: Caller.

Called routines: Cross memory post of IEAVTDSV.

IEAVTSD2 – SVC Dump SRB to Schedule the Copying SRB's

Function: IEAVTSD2 is a SRB scheduled by IEAVAD00 or IEAVTSDX. IEAVTSD2 posts the Started Dump Task. It sets up the invironment for the SRB's IEAVTSD3 and IEAVTSD4 to copy global data to the one-to-one buffer in DUMPSRV's dataspace.

Entry-Point IEAVTSD2:

Callers: Dispatcher.

Exit-Normal: Exit to: the dispatcher.

Entry-Point RETRYFRR records and cleans up IEAVTSD2's resources. It retries or percolates to PERC-FRR, releasing the local lock.

Callers: RTM.

Exit-Normal: Percolates to IEAVTSDS's recovery.

External-References: STATUS, IEAVTSDB, IEAVTSDG, POST, and IEAVTSMG.

IEAVTSD3 — Routine to Copy a Range of Global Storage into DUMPSRV's Scope (single) Dataspace

Function: This module is a SRB scheduled by IEAVTSD2 or by IEAVTSD3, running in DUMPSRV's address space. It is passed a range and a pointer to a page within that range or it selects a range from the global range table. IEAVTSD3 copies the data into DUMPSRV's scope (single) data space.

Entry-Point IEAVTSD3 copies a range of storage into DUMPSRV's data space.

Callers: Dispatcher.

Exit-Normal: Exit to: the disptacher.

Entry-Point IEAVTSRM is the RMTR to free the SRB storage after a PURGEDQ has occurred.

Callers: Dispatcher.

Exit-Normal: Exits to the dispatcher.

External-References: IARQDUMP.

IEAVTSD4 — Routine Scheduled to Copy a subrange or Common Storage to DUMPSRV's Dataspace

Function: This module copies a sub-range of common storage into DUMPSRV's data space storage. IEAVTSD3 determined that this subrange of storage was located on auxiliary storage. It loaded the sub-range into real storage and scheduled IEAVTSD4, an SRB, to do the copying.

Entry-Point IEAVTSD4 copies sub-range of global storage into data space.

Callers: Dispatcher.

Exit-Normal: Exit to: the dispatcher.

Entry-Point IEAVTS4F is the recovery routine for IEAVTSD4.

Callers: RTM.

IEAVTSD5 — SDUMP Set Caller Non-Dispatchable Routine

Function: The diagnosis information for this module is in *MVS/ESA Component Diagnosis: Recovery Termination Manager*

IEAVTSGL - SVC Dump Glue Routine

Function: The purpose of this module is to support branch entry to SDUMP in either 24 or 31 bit addressing mode. If the caller is in 24 bit mode, the high order byte of register 1 and register 13 are cleared to prevent addressing exceptions in IEAVTSDX when it runs in 31 bit addressing mode. The callers registers are saved before passing control to IEAVTSDX.

Entry from: IEAVAD00 on a scheduled dump request on SVC 51. Issuer of the SDUMP macro with BRANCH = YES.

Exit to: IEAVTSDX. (Note: IEAVTSDX does not return to IEAVTSGL.)

Called routines: IEAVTSDX.

IEAVTSFR - SETFRR

Function: The SETFRR macro calls this module to update the FRR stacks. Depending on the request, IEAVTSFR adds or deletes a current stack entry, purges all the entries from the current stack, flushes all the entries from the normal stack, or flushes all the entries from the normal stack and then adds an entry to this stack.

Entry from: SETFRR macro.

Exit to: Caller.

IEAVTSIG - SLIP PER RISGNL Routine

Function: This module adjusts the PSW PER indicators in the I/O, external, and SVC new PSWs, and loads the PER control registers (9-11) with appropriate values when PER monitoring is being activated or deactivated.

Entry from: IEAVTGLB via BALR.

Exit to: Caller.

IEAVTSIN - FRR Stack Initialization

Function: IEAVTSIN is an executable macro included by IEAVNIPO and IEEVCPR to perform FRR stack initialization for a given processor.

Entry from: This inline expansion is included by IEAVNIP0 (during system initialization) and by IEEVCPO (during vary processor processing).

Exit to: Caller.

IEAVTSKT

Function: The diagnosis information for this module is in *MVS/ESA Component Diagnosis*: *Recovery Termination Manager*

IEAVTSLB - SLIP Action Processor - Part 2

Function: This module routes control to the SLIP trap match routines ((IEAVTSL1 or IEAVTSL2) depending on the parameters found in the SCVA)) and processes the MATCHLIM and PRCNTLIM keywords.

Entry from: IEAVTSLP.

Exit to: IEAVTSLE.

Called routines: IEAVTSL1, IEAVTSL2.

IEAVTSLC – SLIP/CMSET Intercept Interface Routine

Function: When SLIP/PER is active, this module intercepts CMSET SET and RESET macros and calls IEAVTSSH to determine if PER needs to be adjusted.

Entry from:

For entry-point IEAVTSLC: Any issuer of the CMSET SET macro when there is an active SLIP trap for that macro.

For entry-point IEAVTSL8: Any issuer of the CMSET RESET, CHKAUTH = NO macro

when there is an active SLIP trap for that macro.

For entry-point IEAVTSL9: Any issuer of the CMSET RESET, CHKAUTH = YES macro when there is an active SLIP trap for that macro.

Exit to: Caller.

IEAVTSLE – SLIP Action Processor – Part 3

Function: This module initiates message processing requested by IEAVTSLP when a trap has been automatically disabled. IEAVTSLE also removes the recovery environment established by IEAVTSLP, and returns to the caller of IEAVTSLP.

Entry from: IEAVTSLB, IEAVTSLR.

Exit to: The caller of IEAVTSLP via BSM.

IEAVTSLP - SLIP Action Processor - Part 1

Function: This module receives control when SLIP is active from either an RTM routine as part of normal processing, or from IEAVTPER after a PER interruption. IEAVTSLP establishes error recovery to match the environment of the caller, serializes the SCE chain, and passes control to IEAVTSLB to continue SLIP action processing.

Entry from: IEAVTRTS, IEAVTRT2, IEAVTRTM, or IEAVTPER via BASSM.

Exit to: IEAVTSLB.

IEAVTSLR - SLIP Processor Recovery

Function: This module provides the FRR recovery for the SLIP processor modules (IEAVTSLP, IEAVTSLB, IEAVTSLE, IEAVTSL1, IEAVTSL2, IEAVTSLS) and the address conversion routine (IEAVTADR) when it is called by SLIP. If a recoverable error has occurred, this module attempts a retry at an appropriate point in the SLIP processor module. If the error is not recoverable, IEAVTSLR requests percolation.

Entry from: IEAVTRTS (FRR router).

Exit to: IEAVTRTS.

IEAVTSLS – SLIP Processor Service Routine

Function: This module is called to: determine the system mode, issue a DUMP, or schedule IEAVTGLB to turn off PER monitoring.

Entry from: IEAVTSLB, IEAVTSL1, IEAVTSL2.

Exit to: Caller.

IEAVTSL1 – SLIP Trap Matching Routine – Part 1

Function: This module determines whether the event qualifier keywords specified on the SLIP command match the current system conditions. IEAVTSL1 processes the ADDRESS, ASID, COMP, ERRTYP, JOBNAME, JSPGM, LPAMOD, MODE, RANGE, and ASIDSA event qualifier keywords.

Exit to: Caller.

IEAVTSL2 - SLIP Trap Matching Routine - Part 2

Function: This module: determines whether the event qualifier keywords specified on the SLIP command match the current system conditions (IEAVTSL2 processes the DATA and PVTMOD event qualifier keywords). When a match is found for all event qualifier keywords, IEAVTSL2 is called to perform the action specified in this trap.

Entry from: IEAVTSLB.

Exit to: Caller.

IEAVTSPR - SVC Dump Parameter Routine

Function: This module is called to perform four different functions.

- Initializes SDUMP storage, copies the callers parameter list and associated lists into SDUMP storage, and merges the requested dumping options with the CHNGDUMP options.
- Validates the callers DCB, if the SDUMP DCB option was specified.
- Parses the callers DCB list and separates the global and local subpools for dumping at different times.
- Adds the ASIDs specified in the ASID, ASIDLST, and LISTS options to the RTCT ASID table.

Entry from: IEAVAD00, IEAVTSDX.

Exit to: Caller.

IEAVTSRB - SVC Dump SRB Routine

Function: IEAVTSRB is the SRB scheduled by IEAVTSDS. The SRB will set the address space environment so that a dump can be taken by setting the tasks of the address space nondispatchable. The SRB will then activate the resident dump task to dump storage in this address space.

Entry-Point IEAVTSRB is the SRB scheduled by IEAVTSDS. The purpose is to initiate the dumping process. The SRB will set the address space environment so that a dump can be taken by setting the tasks of the address space nondispatchable. The SRB will then activate the resident dump task.

Callers: None

Entry-Point SRBFRR1 is a recovery from a failure in the SVC dump SRB Routine.

Exit-Normal: Return to RTM1.

Function: This module compares the actual configuration of the system with the configuration described in the information table. It displays differences, if any, to the operator.

Function: This module can perform the following functions:

- Updates the data set enqueue table to add or change an entry.
- Dequeues the dsname:
- Updates the data set enqueue table to delete an entry.

Entry from: IEFAB4DC, IEFAB459, IEFDB4A1, IEFDB411, IEFDB413, IEFDB418.

Exit from Caller.

Called routines: IEFAB4F7.

IEFGB4UV - Unit Verification

Function: This routine is invoked by system routines that require information or validity checks based on the contents of the eligible devices table (EDT).

Entry from: IEFAB4EC, IEFAB4UV, IEFAB441.

Exit to: Caller. (If the caller is IEFAB4UV, this module exits to the caller of IEFAB4UV.)

Called routines: IEFAB438.

IEFHB4I2 – Display Allocation Scavenge Routine

IEFHB410 - Display Allocation Tables Manager

IEFIB645 - SWA Create Exit Routine

IEFIB650 - Initiator Message Module

Function: This module contains text for initiator messages.

IEFIIC - Initiator Interface Control

Function: This module puts the initiator routines into supervisor state and builds the initiator's SSIB, SSOB header, entrance, options, and exit list (IEL).

Exit to: IEFSD060 via branch.

IEFIMASK - Conversion of Bit Mask

Function: This routine converts bit positions in a string to hexadecimal characters for inclusion in some initiator messages.

Entry from: IEFSD101 or IEFSD161 via branch.

Exit to: The calling module via branch.

IEFIRECM - Initiator Resource Manager

Function: This module cleans up resources used by the initiator in a terminating address space. This routine deletes all CSCBs associated with this address space from the CSCB chain.

IEFISEXR — Initiator Subsystem ESTAE Exit Routine

Function: This module receives control after an abnormal situation occurs in the initiator or subsystem interface resource managers. It issues a DEQ for the CSCB chain and makes an error entry in the LOGREC data set.

IEFJCNTL - JCLS to SWA Conversion

Function: This routine, a part of the master subsystem, converts a JCLS chain to SWA control blocks by invoking the converter, then the interpreter (via the SWA-create interface).

Error exit To caller's ESTAE routine with a user abend code X'0B1', X'0B4', or X'0B5'.

IEFJDIRD - Pseudo Access Method Direct Read

Function: This routine, a part of the master subsystem, moves the specified record into a specified buffer so that the record can be updated.

IEFJDSNA - Data Set Name Assignment

Function: This routine, a part of the master subsystem, assigns a data set name to each SYSOUT data set specified in the master JCL or in the JCL used to start a subsystem.

Entry from: Allocation.

Exit to: Caller.

IEFJDWRT – Pseudo Access Method Direct Write

Function: This routine, a part of the master subsystem, overlays an old record with an updated record from a buffer.

Entry from: The converter via the RPL/ACB interface.

Exit to: Caller.

IEFJJCLS – JCL to JCLS Conversion

Function: This routine, a part of the master subsystem, converts the master scheduler JCL (MSTRJCL) to a JCLS chain.

Entry from: IEFJJOBS.

Exit to: Caller.

Error exit To caller's ESTAE routine with a user abend code X'0B1'.

IEFJJOBS - Subsystem Initiation

Function: This routine, a part of the master subsystem, controls the creation of SWA control blocks when the master scheduler or a subsystem is being started.

Entry from: The initiator via the subsystem interface.

Exit to: The initiator.

Error exit To caller's ESTAE routine with a user abend code X'0B1'.

IEFJJTRM - Subsystem Job Termination

Function: This routine, a part of the master subsystem, is a dummy routine. It replaces the normal job termination function when the job being terminated is a subsystem.

Entry from: A system routine via the IEFSSREQ macro.

Exit to: The system routine.

IEFJRASP - Common Request Router

Function: This routine, a part of the master subsystem, handles requests that require processing for all active subsystems except the master subsystem.

Entry from: A system routine via the subsystem interface.

IEFJREAD – Pseudo Access Method Sequential Read

Function: This routine, a part of the master subsystem, moves a record from a chain of records to a buffer and prepares for the next record to be read from the chain.

Function: This module checks the resource manager parameter list for task or address space termination indicators. It then builds either a task or address space SSOB extension. Function: This module contains messages for subsystem initialization and PARMLIB processing. These messages are accessed and issued by IEFJSIMW.

IEFJSIMW — Subsystem Initialization and Parmlib Processing Message Writer

Function: This module issues messages, which are contained in IEFJSIMM. It issues these messages during subsystem initialization (for IEFJSBLD and IEFJSIN2) and during the processing of the SET MPF command (for IEECB805).

Entry from: IEECB805 and modules used during subsystem initialization (IEFJSBLD and IEFJSIN2). (See *Component Diagnosis: System Initialization.*)

IEFQBJST — SWA Manager Storage Table for JES3

Function: IEFQBJST is a 256-byte translate table used by SWA Manager to assign blocks to JES3.

IEFQBMST - SWA Manager Storage Table

Function: IEFQBMST is a 256-byte translate table used by SWA Manager to assign blocks above and below the line.

IEFQB550 - SWA Manager Move Mode Interface Routine

Function: This module intercepts branches to SWA manager move mode routine and routes the requests to IEFQB551 in EPLPA.

Entry from: Initiator/terminator, scheduler restart, converter/interpreter, JES3.

Entry to IEFQB551 via BSM.

IEFQB551 - SWA Manager Move Mode Routine

Function: This module assigns, writes, reads, or deletes scheduler work area (SWA) blocks in move mode.

Entry from: IEFQB550, IEFQB580, or IEFQB585.

Exit to: Caller via BSM.

IEFQB555 - SWA Manager Locate Mode Interface Routine

Function: This module intercepts branches to SWA manager locate mode routine and routes the requests to IEFQB556 in EPLPA.

Entry from: Scheduler restart or JES3.

Exit to: IEFQB556 via BSM.

IEFQB556 - SWA Manager Locate Mode Routine

Function: This module assigns, writes, reads, or deletes scheduler work area (SWA) blocks in locate mode.

Entry from: IEFQB555 or directly from the issuer of the SWAREQ macro instruction.

Exit to: Caller or issuer of SWAREQ via BSM.

IEFQB580 — QMNGRIO Macro Interface Handler

Function: This module provides an interface to SWA manager functions from data management routines that use the QMNGRIO macro instruction. IEFQB580 builds and initializes a queue management parameter area (QMPA) for the module requesting SWA manager functions.

Entry-Point CSCHDIE: Performs the disabled interrupt exit functions when the I/O interrupt is received for a clear subchannel instruction that was invoked by IOSRCDEV. CSCHDIE indicates to IOSVIRBH:

- That IOSVIRBH is to schedule IOSRCDEV at entry-point RESUME to continue processing the clear device request.

Callers: IOSVIRBH.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Entry-Point TIMERDIE: Performs the disabled interrupt exit functions when the external interrupt is received for a SETDIE issued by IOSRCDEV. TIMERDIE schedules IOSRCDEV at entry-point RESUME to continue processing the clear device request.

Entry-Point CDEVFRR: Recovers from an unexpected error in:

- This routine.
- A synchronous routine invoked by this routine that does not have an FRR established or whose FRR percolates the error.

Entry-Point FRRRETRY: Performs retry processing after IOSRCHDR has abnormally terminated. It ensures that the UCB lock is held and returns to the mainline to complete the device recovery.

Exit-Normal: Same as entry-point IOSRCHDR.

IORCHDS -- IOS Channel Path Device Scan

Function: This routine initiates channel path device recovery for each device that has recovery path installed.

IOSRCHPR – IOS Channel Path Recovery

Function: This module is called by the asynchronous channel report word (CRW) processor (IOSRACRW) to recover the failing channel path whenever the retrieved CRW indicates a channel path is the source of the error. IOSRCHPR is also called to force a channel path offline because of the CONFIG CHP, FORCE operator command or to process some Hot I/O conditions that require channel path processing.

IOSRHDET – Hot I/O Detection

Function: This module determines if Hot I/O is occurring. Hot I/O is defined as a hardware malfunction which results in the generation of repeated unsolicited I/O interrupts. If a Hot I/O condition is detected, the IOCSLIH field of the IOCOM is updated to point to the Hot I/O SLIH (entry-point IOSRSLIH in this module) rather than IOSVSLIH. When the next interrupt for this device occurs, the Hot I/O SLIH receives control to stop the device from presenting unsolicited interrupts and to schedule Hot I/O recovery (IOSRHREC).

Callers: IOSVIRBU.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Entry-Point IOSRSLIH: This entry receives control for all interrupts after a Hot I/O condition has been detected. It stops the Hot device from presenting unsolicited interrupts and it schedules Hot I/O recovery.

Exit-Normal: If pending status is for a Hot device, then return is made to the I/O FLIH. If pending status is not for a Hot device, then return is made to the I/O SLIH.

Entry-Point IOSRHTPI: This entry receives control from the I/O SLIH (IOSVSLIH) when a new interrupt is brought in via a TPI instruction and the address contained in IOCSLIH is not the I/O SLIH's own entry address. This entry-point is currently the same as IOSRSLIH.

Callers: I/O SLIH.

Exit-Normal: Same as IOSRSLIH entry-point.

Entry-Point HDETFRR: Recovers from an unexpected error that caused exit to RTM. This routine records the error and retries if possible. If unable to retry, it frees resources and percolates the error.

Callers: RTM.

External-References: IOSVSLIH, IOSRHREC.

IOSRHREC – Hot I/O Recovery

Function: This module attempts to recover from Hot I/O (a hardware malfunction that results in the generation of repeated interrupts).

Entry-Point HRECFRR: Records the error, reschedules the Hot I/O recovery processing, and, if possible, retries to clean up resources.

IOSRMCH – IOS Machine Check Exit

Function: Checks for and processes I/O machine checks.

Callers: IGFPMSCA, IGFPMAIN, and IEAVTACR.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller or exits to IGFPTERM to terminate the system.

Exit-Error: To machine check interrupt handler or to RTM.

External-References: IGFPTERM, IOSRACRW.

IOSRMIHI – Missing Interrupt Handler Initialization Routine

Function: This modules creates the environment needed to scan for possible missing interrupt conditions.

Callers: IEEMB860.

Exit-Normal: Return to RTM to either retry mainline processing or to continue with termination.

External-References: A call is issued to SETDIE, which is pointed to by TPCSDIE, to initially start each timer.

IOSRMIHL – MIH LOGREC Recording Module

Function: Writes records to LOGREC.

Callers: IOSRMIHP, IOSRMIHR.

Exit-Normal: None, this module goes into a Wait for the next POSTing of the LOGREC ECB while MIH termination is not occurring.

Exit-Error: MIH processing is terminating due to the MIHTERM bit being on for a MIH processing problem.

IOSRMIHM - MIH Message Writing Module

Function: Issues messages for requests queued out of the message stack header in the MIH work area.

Callers: IOSRMIHP, IOSRMIHR.

Exit-Normal: None, this module goes into a Wait for the next POSTing of the message ECB while MIH termination is not occurring.

Exit-Error: MIH processing is terminating due to the MIHTERM bit being on for a MIH processing problem.

IOSRMIHP – Missing Interrupt Handler Analysis Module

Function: Detects and processes missing interrupts from I/O devices. IOSRMIHP schedules a global SRB for entry into this module at the entry-point appropriate to the type of timer interval that expired. The SRB has been initialized by IOSRMIHT.

Entry-Point MIHRFRR: Performs recovery for failures in IOSRMIHR mainline code.

Callers: RTM.

Exit-Normal: Returns to RTM.

External-References: IOSVHSCH, IOSVSTSQ, IOSVURVL.

IOSRMIHT – Missing Interrupt Handler Initialization Routine

Function: This module creates the environment needed to scan UCBs for possible missing interrupt conditions.

Callers: Master scheduler.

Exit-Normal: None. This routine enters a wait state until IOSRMIHP determines that MIH processing should be terminated or until the logging subtask or message subtask abnormally terminates.

Entry-Point MIHESTAE: Terminates MIH processing.

Callers: RTM.

Exit-Normal: Returns to RTM to either retry mainline processing or to continue with termination.

Entry-Point ESTIENTM: Performs ESTAI recovery for IOSRMIHM. Takes an SVC dump and continues with termination whenever subtask IOSRMIHM fails.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Entry-Point IECVSMEG: EXCP processing for acquiring large block(s).

Callers: IECVEXCP.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Entry-Point IECVSMEF: EXCP processing for freeing large block(s).

Callers: IECVEXCP.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Entry-Point IOSVSMPF: Normal processing for purging/freeing large and RQE (medium) blocks in the caller's address space. This function is called by purge (SVC 16) when it receives an address space halt request (usually as a result of an out-of-storage ABEND or address space termination.

IOSVSSCQ - Start Subchannel Queueing Routine

Function: Queues a START I/O request onto the appropriate UCB and calls the start subchannel initiation routine to attempt to start the request.

Callers: Any I/O driver or the STARTIO Compatibility Interface Routine (IECVSTIO).

Exit-Normal: BSM to the caller's return address.

Entry-Point SSCQFRR: Handles error conditions and attempts to recover use of the function.

IOSVSTSQ – IOS Store Subchannel Queue Routine

Function: Queues a Store Subchannel request on the appropriate UCB and calls the Store Subchannel initiation routine (IOSVSTSC) to execute the request.

Callers: Users of Store Subchannel service.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller using the address and addressing mode supplied at entry in register 14.

Exit-Error: Returns to the caller using the address and addressing mode supplied at entry in register 14. See also entry-point STSQFRR.

Entry-Point STSQFRR: Recovers from an unexpected error that caused exit to RTM.

Callers: RTM.

Exit-Normal: Returns to RTM specifying retry and the address of a routine in IOSVSTSQ.

IOSVSUCB - UCB Scan Service

Function: Provides a scan of the UCB chain for all UCB's or all UCB's within a specified device class by being repetitively invoked by the caller.

IOSVSWAP – Swap Service Routine

Function: This routine swaps the contents of two UCBs for dynamic device reconfiguration (DDR) and the MSS ERP.

IOSVURDT – Unconditional Reserve Detection Routine

If either of these conditions exist, unconditional reserve processing continues with a call to IECVDURP. If the error is considered temporary, this module calls IOSLEVEL to reset the unconditional reserve level and redrive the device. On all subsequent entries, this module calls IECVDURP.

IRARMSWP - Swap Algorithm

Function: ITRF007F is part of the system trace formatter. ITRF007F filters out or formats a VSRn trace table entry (TTE) by invoking the default USRn TTE formatting routine (ITRFDEFU). ITRF007F is designed to be replaced by a userwritten module if a format other than the default USRn format is desired.

ITRFBR — System Trace Branch and Address Space TTE Formatter Routines

Function: ITRFBR is part of the system trace formatter. ITRFBR formats branch and address space trace table entries (TTEs).

- The ITRFBR entry-point formats one or more consecutive 31-bit or 24-bit branch (BR) TTEs contained within a single trace work buffer. ITRFBR formats up to seven consecutive branch TTEs as a single output record.
- The ITRFPC entry-point formats a PC TTE.
- The ITFRPT entry-point formats a PT TTE.
- The ITRFSSAR entry-point formats a SSAR TTE.

Exit-Error: To RTM via an ABEND SVC.

Entry-Point ITRFPC: Formats a program call (PC) TTE.

Entry-Point ITRFPT: Formats a program transfer (PT) TTE.

Callers: IEAVETEF.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller via BR 14.

Exit-Error: To RTM via an ABEND SVC.

Entry-Point ITRFSSAR: Formats a setsecondary-address-register (SSAR) TTE.

Callers: IEAVETEF.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller via BR 14.

Exit-Error: To RTM via an ABEND SVC.

External-References: IEAVETPB entry-point in IEAVETFA.

ITRFHEX — System Trace Default Hex/Explicit/USRn TTE Formatter Routines

Function: ITRFHEX contains three formatters:

- Entry-point ITRFHEX formats the remainder of the current trace buffer in the default hex format.
- Entry-point ITRFEXP formats the current TTE in the default explicit TTE format.
- Entry-point ITRFDEFU formats the current USRn TTE in the default USRn TTE format. The IBM-supplied USRn TTE formatting routines, ITRF0n7F (where n = 0-F), use this entry-point to perform their function.

Callers: IEAVETFC.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Exit-Error: To RTM via an ABEND.

Entry-Point ITRFEXP: Formats the current TTE in default explicit TTE format. The trace entry for-

matter, IEAVETEF, calls this entry-point when it encounters an explicit TTE of an unknown type (therefore, the TTE does not have a standard formatter routine), or when the type is known but the formatter routine for the TTE determines that the TTE cannot be formatted normally because it has an invalid subtype or unexpected length.

Callers: IEAVETEF.

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Exit-Error: To RTM via an ABEND.

Entry-Point ITRFDEFU: Formats a USRn TTE on behalf of one of the IBM-supplied USRn TTE formatters (ITRF007F-ITRF0F7F).

Callers: ITRF0n7F (n = 0-F).

Exit-Normal: Returns to the caller.

Exit-Error: To RTM via an ABEND.

External-References: IEAVETFA, IEAVETPB.

ITT - Component Trace

Function: All modules and macros with this prefix are part of the component TRACE component. The diagnosis information for this component is in *MVS/ESA Component Diagnosis: Component Trace*.

ITV - Data-in-Virtual

Function: All modules and macros with this prefix are part of the data-in-virtual component. The diagnosis information for this component is in *MVS/ESA Component Diagnosis: Data-in-Virtual.*


